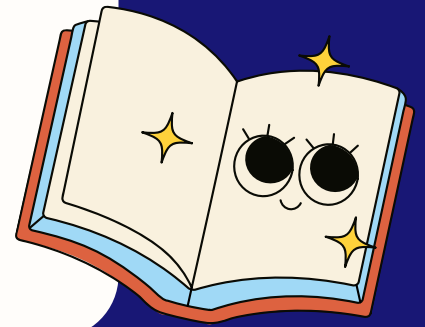

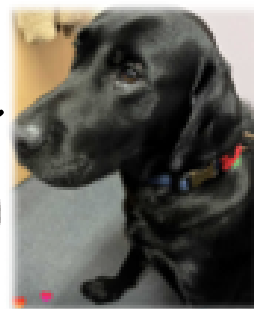

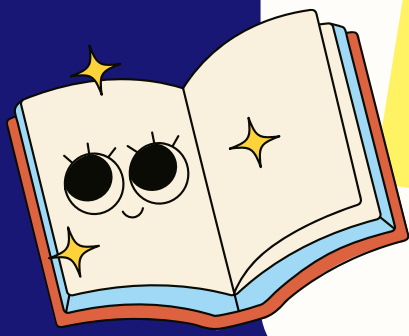

Serving my community today made me feel: proud and responsible because it good helping and when I did it made me have a good feeling.

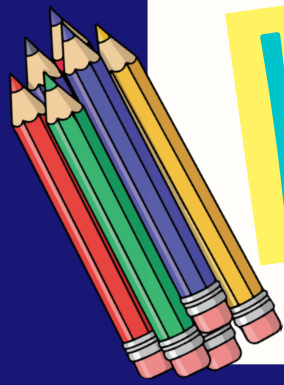

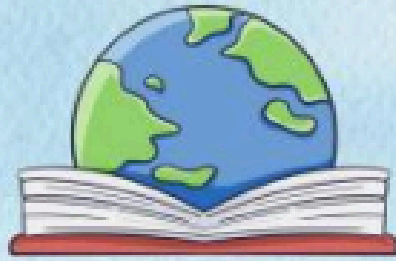
