Key




Helps us understand map symbols. Also known as a legend.

Compass Rose




Aerial View

### What is a Map? Types of Maps:

A map is a drawing of an actual place that uses lines and symbols to represent real-life objects. People have used maps for hundreds of years to help them travel from place to place.

There are many different types of maps, such as:

- Sketch maps
- Road maps
- Climate maps
- World maps
- Train maps

### Key Features:

Key features of maps include: a title, a compass rose, symbols, a key and different colours for important things, such as green for forests and blue for rivers. Maps are usually drawn from an aerial view. We can look at aerial photos to see the main physical and human features of places. Aerial photos are taken by aircraft, or other flying objects.

To watch and sometimes also listen to something carefully.


#### A Map of Our Local Area - Collierswood




People use a **compass** to help them position and use a map accurately.
